ORDER FOR POSTING OF GARNISHMENT

This case comes before the Court on the Verified Motion for Service by Posting and Mailing Pursuant To § 6-6-394.01 filed by Plaintiff. Having considered the same, it is **ORDERED** that said Motion is **GRANTED**. Plaintiff is entitled to serve the defendant with notice of the garnishment in this case by posting of the garnishment pursuant to *Ala. Code* (1975) §6-6-394.1.

It is **FURTHER ORDERED** as follows:

1. The clerk shall post a copy of the Process of Garnishment and this Order authorizing the posting to the clerk's official website for four continuous weeks.
2. The clerk shall post a copy of the Process of Garnishment and this Order authorizing the posting in a designated and conspicuous location within the Autauga County courthouse for four continuous weeks.
3. At the time of the posting, the clerk of Court shall also send by regular U.S. Mail a copy of the posted Process of Garnishment and this Order to the defendant at the defendant's last known address and shall make note in the electronic case file of the posting and mailing.
4. Pursuant to statute, a fee of fifteen dollars (\$15) is assessed as additional court costs to be collected by the Circuit Clerk. The moving party shall be responsible for this assessment and the cost of mailing. The additional fee and costs may be made taxable to the defendant upon motion to the Court.
5. Following the four-week posting period above, or earlier if the defendant is served by other means, the plaintiff may move for condemnation of garnished funds.

The clerk is directed to timely transmit a copy of this order to the parties and to any attorney(s) of record.
